HANWAY SCHOLARSHIP

The Hanway Scholarship was created in memory of Jonas Hanway, one of the founders of the Marine Society, to support seafarers who need to take qualifications essential to work at sea or to support seafarers with their continuing professional development.

- 1. The Marine Society may offer, subject to conditions, a Hanway Scholarship to a British seafarer domiciled in the UK. College fees and associated costs while undertaking studies for professional advancement may be covered.
- 2. Application for a scholarship should be submitted at least one month prior to the start of the course. It is not policy to grant scholarships or loans retrospectively i.e. if the course has already started.
- 3. We may require documentary evidence from the course provider that you are starting the course on the date agreed. We shall not release any funds until we have this evidence.
- 4. All sections of the form should be completed clearly and in full.
- 5. The Marine Society is seeking a well thought out financial plan that will facilitate successful completion. We also need to be assured that the course is relevant to your professional development and/or required to work at sea and that other means of funding it have been explored.

Financial assistance for UK seafarers

Notes

There are several funds available to help seafarers advance their professional and academic qualifications:

The Marine Society's Hanway or Worcester Scholarships, interest-free loans and the John William Slater Scholarships.

- 1. The Hanway Scholarship was created in memory of Jonas Hanway, one of the founders of the Marine Society in 1756 and is primarily aimed at seafarers who need to take qualifications essential to work at sea or to support seafarers with their continuing professional development where there is no support from their employer/ship owner or for those who do not qualify for a Slater Scholarship (see note 4). Scholarships are restricted to British seafarers domiciled in the United Kingdom. Applications for a Hanway Scholarship can be made to the Marine Society at any time. Each application is considered on its merits. The Marine Society's decision is final and the charity is under no obligation to give reasons for that decision.
- 2. The Marine Society's Worcester Scholarships are primarily aimed at the qualified mariner who wishes to gain a higher academic qualification in the maritime field such as a BEng (Hons) or BSc(Hons) in Maritime Operations or Marine Engineering which would lead on to a continued career in the maritime industry. In certain special circumstances, a Worcester Scholarship may be awarded to a seafarer for a higher professional qualification where there is no support from their employer/ship owner, or for those who are overqualified for a Slater Scholarship (see note 4). Scholarships are restricted to British seafarers domiciled in the United Kingdom. Applications for a Worcester Scholarship can be made to the Marine Society at any time. Each application is considered on its merits. The Marine Society's decision is final and the charity is under no obligation to give reasons for that decision.
- 3. The Marine Society also offers interest-free loans to seafarers to supplement their own resources whilst studying at college or attending courses necessary for their employment or advancement. These loans are paid in convenient instalments and become repayable over a period of 24 months to begin no later than two months after the commencement of the course. As with the scholarships, loans are only granted for courses directly related to the maritime sector and are restricted to British seafarers domiciled in the United Kingdom.
- 4. The Marine Society, on behalf of Nautilus International, administers the John William Slater Scholarship for Ratings (Deck and Engine) aspiring to qualify for their first Officer of the Watch Certificate of Competency and Electro Technical Officers, yacht and Workboat crew gain STCW certification. About 50 scholarships are granted each year. Applications can be made to the Marine Society at any time. Each application is considered on its merits. Candidates are required to write a short narrative on themselves, their reasons for applying, and provide a reference from a senior officer or their shipping company.
- 5. The Merchant Navy Training Board is a registered Training Provider for the Government's Support for Maritime Training (SMarT) funding scheme to assist eligible unemployed seafarers wishing to undertake certain approved courses of study.
